



Thank you for your interest in the Enovert Community Trust (formerly known as the Cory Environmental Trust in Britain). This is an independent Environmental Body funded through the Landfill Communities Fund (LCF) by Enovert Management Limited.

The Trustees welcome bids to help the Trust meet its objectives to enhance and improve the environment for communities who live and work in the vicinity of an Enovert landfill site. All projects must meet one of the criteria set out on Page 2 of the enclosed Application Form.

The maximum grant is generally awarded by ECT is around £30k and the Trust requires 10% independent 3rd party funding* (e.g., for a grant of £20k you will need to identify a 3rd party who will be willing to contribute £2k to Enovert Management Ltd to reimburse it for the tax credit).

Should you decide to make an application for funding please include as much relevant detail as possible as this will help Trustees in the selection process. However, please do not **spiral bind** your papers, as it makes them difficult to copy. Also, please do not scan your documents into one PDF – it is fine to send multiple documents via a few emails or using WeTransfer or similar. 4 Sep 26 for a meeting on 20 Oct 26; 4 Dec 26 for a meeting on 19 Jan 27 and quarterly thereafter.

*ENTRUST, the scheme's regulator, now allows the project proposer to provide the 10% contribution, if it does not use landfill tax credits to make the payment, or funds from a contractor that is working on the project, nor should the contributor derive a unique benefit from the project going ahead. Different rules apply to registered Environmental Bodies.
